***(As a progression OR for upskilling existing staff-
Classroom and PE focus)***

- Sports Coach in a school/community setting (L4)
- Standards will run for 13-15 months and require an end-point assessment.
- Level 4 (19 months)



What do our apprentices go on to do?

Achieved very high pass rates!

- 32% Progressed into higher education
- 25% Progressed onto an advanced apprenticeship within their school
- 17% were employed within their school
- 17% progressed into employment within coaching companies
- 3% Travelling
- 6% Unsure of next steps

Wages from April 23 - Please note these wages are negotiable and existing staff remain unchanged

- Employed and hosted within a primary, secondary or special educational needs school.
- Apprenticeship wages – based on 30 hours a week.

The first year of apprenticeship:

- Approx. £192 a week. 56 weeks minimum. You will not be expected to take holiday leave during term time. £10,752 over 56 weeks.
- 19 plus will be paid the same in their first year of an apprenticeship with a potential negotiated uplift for experience.

Second year of apprenticeship:

- 18-20 will be paid £258 a week (£14,448 - 56 weeks)
- 21+ will be paid £343 a week (£19,219 – 56 weeks)
- If you are employed on a Term-time only contract this may extend your time on the Apprenticeship and your wages will be pro-rata.

NEXT STEPS

Questions to ask yourself:

- Could this be a pathway for me?
- What opportunities are available at this moment in time?
- Would it give me an opportunity to gain experience within a professional setting?
- Do I enjoy sports / working in a classroom?
- Do I enjoy working with young pupils?
- Could I work in a school?
- Am I interested in a career to do with sports or teaching?
- Do I want to gain qualifications whilst gaining valuable experience in a working environment?
