- They offer a range of professional and subject or phase specific sessions.


What do we offer?

Subject knowledge development – ITT should address core content knowledge in teaching subjects with appropriate rigour, including the definition and scope of the subject, why it matters and the concepts that underpin it (at both primary and secondary level).

Subject-specific pedagogy – ITT should address subject-specific issues such as: phases of progression within the subject; common misconceptions in the subject; linkages between subjects; and, most importantly, how to make it accessible and meaningful to learners at different abilities and stages of development.

Trainees need access to sufficient high quality subject expertise – we have found that universities can be well-placed to provide this. *The best partnerships also make systematic use of subject expertise in schools* (such as Specialist Leaders in Education (SLEs)). We have also found that cross-phase expertise can be used particularly effectively in some partnerships.

Conducted in schools and coordinated by Professional and Subject Mentors:

Interactive self-study materials that explain the research behind the Early Career Framework and give exemplifications of what this looks like in the classroom.

There is protected time in year 1 as part of these materials to observe colleagues and to be observed.

Conducted in schools and coordinated Subject Mentors:

One-to-one sessions to help ECTs translate the research into their own practice and reflect on their learning and development.

Coordinated by the Watford Partnership:

Group sessions, delivered either face-to-face, for ECTs to *explore* the Early Career Framework with their peers.

These sessions are facilitated by an expert practitioner who extends ECTs' thinking and supports their planning by sharing practical applications of the research in the classroom.

Conducted in schools and coordinated by PM's:

Will use the EDT training resources and deliver the early career teacher and mentor training contextualised to their school settings

Herts for Learning (via Chiltern TSH) - Oversee the accreditation of the ECF across all schools in the Partnership
