Purpose of the role

To work with teachers as part of a professional team to support teaching and learning for SEN pupils in the Early Years. Providing learning support to pupils who need particular help to overcome barriers to learning, such as those with moderate, severe, profound and multiple learning difficulties and/or behavioural, social, communication or sensory needs.

Working with teachers to support teaching and learning by working with individuals or small groups of pupils under the direction of teaching staff. May be responsible for some learning activities within the overall teaching plan, enabling other members of the Early Years team to support pupils with particular SEN needs.

Responsibilities

- Support pupils in self-directed play and early learning activities, following the particular interests of pupils.
- Promote increased active engagement in play-based learning activities for pupils.
- Experiment with introducing new areas of interest for pupils.
- Encourage pupils to engage with other pupils within the class and/or school community.
- Implement planned learning activities as agreed with the teacher, adjusting activities according to pupils' responses as appropriate.
- Participate in planning, monitoring, assessment and evaluation of learning activities with the teacher, providing feedback to the teacher.
- Support learning by arranging/preparing resources for lessons/activities under the direction of the teacher, or self-directed as appropriate.
- Support pupils in social and emotional wellbeing, reporting back to the teacher as appropriate.
- Share information about pupils with other staff, parents/carers and external agencies as appropriate.
- Understand and support independent learning and inclusion of all pupils as required.
- Work with pupils on specific targets as identified in EHCP's and IEP's, or on therapy or care
 programmes, designed and supervised by the SENCO, class teacher or external
 professionals/agencies.
- If necessary/appropriate, attend to pupils' personal needs including intimate toilet care or changing of clothing.

- Supervise pupils during breaktime and lunchtimes; either playing with or observing safe play behaviours.
- Provide 1:1 support during school events or on educational visits.
- Undertake gentle moving and handling activities as required.

Please note that the responsibilities listed above describe the post as it is as present. The post holder is expected to accept any reasonable alterations that may from time to time be necessary.

Job Context

- The job holder will be one of typically three adults within our Reception Class of 14 pupils, one
 of which will be the class teacher/SENCO. The role is predominately to support one pupil with
 specific SEN needs, as outlined in their EHCP assessed at Specialist level. The job holder will
 sometimes undertake general teaching assistant duties within the class which will enable other
 class adults to support the pupil in question.
- The position is offered on a temporary contract and is attached to the child and funding, with the potential to extend the role dependent on the needs across the school.
