#### **Teaching & Learning**

- Plan with the support of Year group and deliver engaging lessons using the Key Stage 1 National Curriculum,
- Use Bug Club Phonics and Talk for Writing strategies to support literacy development.
- Promote reasoning and problem-solving in Maths using concrete resources like Numicon, tens frames, and number lines.
- Incorporate practical experiences, visits, and visitors to make learning real and memorable.

#### **Assessment & Progress**

- Use formative and summative assessment to monitor pupil progress.
- Maintain accurate records and contribute to pupil reports and parent consultations.
- Support children in achieving excellent outcomes in national assessments, including the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check.

#### **Classroom Environment**

- Create a safe, inclusive, and stimulating classroom that reflects the school's values.
- Promote positive behaviour and emotional wellbeing through consistent routines and expectations.
- Work collaboratively with teaching assistants and support staff to meet individual pupil needs.

#### **Professional Duties**

- Participate in staff meetings, INSET days, and whole-school initiatives.
- Engage in ongoing professional development and reflective practice.
