A group of Year 5 boys, led by Mrs Roberts, performed wonderful drumming inspired by the music of Curacao.

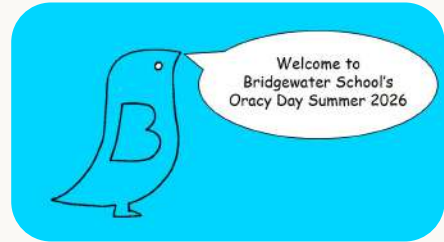
A rousing rendition of Try Everything brought our diverse music assembly to a fitting and joyful close.

Oracy Days

Making speaking and listening a priority

Speaking and listening skills are incredibly important for our children as they move through school and into their working lives, so we have created a comprehensive approach to oracy at Bridgewater. This year, we have made progress in rolling out our strategy, holding two dedicated Oracy Days to bolster our already strong focus on oracy during day to day learning.



The children have set ground rules for talk in their classrooms and been able to participate in a range of fun activities including debates, presentations, word games and recitals. We are looking forward to building further on these activities next year.

Poetry Book

Inspired by a Year 6 pupil

A brilliant poem, *The Blue Gates*, written by Olivia in Year 6, sparked the idea to compile our very own *Bridgewater Poetry Book* filled with contributions from members of the school. Children and adults have written beautifully about their experiences at Bridgewater and their hopes for the future. Their poetic creations have also given us even more opportunities to hear children's oracy skills in action!

Friday Assemblies

Weekly contributions by all classes

An important strand of our oracy strategy has been showcasing oracy in every Friday celebration assembly. Each week, children from a different class have talked to the whole school about some aspect of their learning and it has been wonderful to see so many confident, clear presentations from children putting their public speaking skills into action. We will keep this tradition going next year as well.

The Haven

Small group learning

Helping children make accelerated progress

Since opening in September, the Haven has welcomed more than 80 children from Years 2-6 for small group learning in writing and maths. The Haven teachers have used evidence-based approaches to help children close particular gaps and fulfil their potential, including in some cases exceeding the expected standard. Using the indoor and outdoor spaces



imaginatively has enabled us to support children with movement and brain breaks to maximise their chances of success and many have returned to their classes having made accelerated progress and grown significantly in confidence.

Underpinning inclusion

Nurture and meeting SEMH needs

The vision of the Haven from the outset has been to support inclusion for all children who find being at school challenging. This year, the Haven teachers have offered bespoke provision to enable a number of children from across the school to be successful every day, accessing learning each morning that has been carefully tailored to their individual needs and interests. This nurturing approach has also been replicated during break and lunchtimes and in the afternoons to help children with a range of social, emotional and mental health needs to experience success at Bridgewater.

After-school provision

A versatile indoor/outdoor space

The Haven is a shared facility, in which Rialize has offered after-school care for children in Years 3 and 4. During the heatwaves, the patio provided the perfect location for a paddling pool to cool feet at the end of a long day!

The future

Building on strong foundations

More than 100 children have learned in the Haven during our first year and we are committed to welcoming even more to benefit from this unique provision, created through a Bridgewater community effort, during our second year.
