Thank you for your interest in our vacancy. We are looking for someone to work as a SEN Learning Support Assistant H4 in our Speech and Language Base.

- 1 x H4 LSA 31.25 hours per week 8:30am – 3:30pm (Currently based in the Speech and Language Base) Fixed Term Contract until April 2021.

The position will involve working within the base and in different classrooms across the school supporting pupils with EHCPs for Speech, Language and Communication Needs.

You will have a good level of English and Maths (GCSE grade C or equivalent) and be committed to developing your own practice. As a school we are committed to supporting our staff developing and have supported our learning support assistants to become teachers through our School Direct training.

Across the bases, we have up to 22 pupils who have EHCPs for speech, language and communication difficulties. These children integrate into their mainstream classrooms in the afternoon. These factors mean that in order to reach age related expectations and beyond, children need to make excellent progress, in every class in every year. This can only be achieved through having excellent staff members.
