Outdoor learning and Forest School

Outdoor learning is a core part of our ethos here at Bridgewater. Pupils take part in lessons in a variety of outdoor spaces, including our Early Years Meadow (which provides a range of opportunities for Nursery and Reception children including in the outdoor kitchen, mud pit, tepee, climbing area and woodland); courtyards throughout the school; our huge field (including a log circle which is perfect for reading and

story-telling); our playground spaces; a Nature Reserve with



a wildlife pond; and our woodland with its amphitheatre, Forest School fire-pit, and shelter. Outdoor learning is led by our Assistant Headteacher, who is a qualified Forest School practitioner. We hold a Gold Award from the Woodland Trust Green Tree Schools scheme and we are a Tree Charter School.

Enriching our curriculum

We're delighted to be able to offer a huge range of extra curricular clubs at Bridgewater to pupils from Years 1 to 6, including:

- sports clubs such as athletics, tri-golf, hockey, tag rugby, cricket, netball, handball, football, basketball, tennis and street dance
- music clubs such as Boomwhacker percussion band, song-writing club, musical theatre, recorder and choir
- a wide range of other clubs and activities including gardening, Mathletics, Technology Club, French, colouring, knitting, drama, gardening, yoga, chess and board games.

More than 90% of pupils in the school take part in extra-curricular activities. Running club, for example, sees our children run in the beautiful countryside around our school before the start of the school day, accompanied by parents and staff. Children from a range of sporting abilities attend, some working their way up to running 5km and others running at their own pace.

Children can take extra curricular music lessons, which are provided by our peripatetic music teachers.

Our trips and WOW days are very popular with our children. All classes have three WOW days per year which might be a themed day in school with activities and food linked to a topic they are studying or a trip out to support their learning. Recent examples include visits to Verulamium Museum, a trip to College Lake and visiting a bronze age settlement. Our pupils attend annual events such as our trip to the pantomime and our carol service. They also take part in regular class assemblies which provide an opportunity to share their learning with parents.







Our Bridgewater Family

We highly value our wider school community at Bridgewater and we know that our staff, parents and children do too. We have lots of opportunities for parents, carers, grandparents and the local community to get involved in reading or sewing with our pupils, accompanying trips or helping at our "Big Dig" events in our school grounds. Parents are encouraged to give as much or as little of their time as they are able to.



Our pupils raise money for charity every year, learning about the causes they support at the same time. In August last year, one of our teachers visited Zambia to support a children's centre and to help create a bore-hole to provide clean, safe water for their village. Our children learned about her trip and raised money through sponsorship for carrying water during their daily mile walk—some of them carrying the water on their head. We were awarded an International Schools Award from the British Council for our work on supporting a link-community in Nepal, which had been devastated by the earthquake there.

We also work with community partners on various projects, for example we worked with Berkhamsted Raiders Community Football Club to Crowdfund for two defibrillators on the school site.



Our parent teacher association, the Bridgewater School Association (BSA) provides a range of hugely enjoyable events at the school. These include a film night for our children, a school disco, the Christmas and summer fairs, a quiz night for parents, a circus, a family camping event and more.

Independent learning

We believe in a broad curriculum, preparing our children for academic success and also to be confident young people equipped with the life skills they need for their future.

An important part of our approach is to encourage independent learning with strong emphasis on building resilience and a growth mindset. We want all our children to be prepared to take risks in their learning and to be highly engaged in school life.

Wellbeing and inclusivity

We value highly the wellbeing of our school community as well as the differences between our pupils and what makes them unique. We believe that an inclusive approach to education enriches the experience of school for all children. We feel passionately about equipping all of our children with positive attitudes and experiences so that they have a deeper understanding about their own wellbeing and the world in which they live.

School houses

All pupils and staff at Bridgewater are members of one of three houses. Our classes are all named after birds, starting with Ducklings in Nursery then working up to Buzzard and Kite in Year 6. In turn, our houses are named after mythical birds: Griffin, Phoenix and Roc.

The house system allows pupils to mix with those from other year groups, including their siblings, when taking part in forest school, art, music, drama and sport. This encourages pupils to work as teams and motivates them to achieve their potential. Good attendance in school and using the walking bus to travel to school also win house points. There is a healthy competitive spirit in assembly when we work out which house has the most star awards that month!

Wrap-around care and holiday club

Our wraparound care is operated by local provider 'Rialize'. Led by Ria

Hales and Ali Bunting, two well-established and much-loved local childcare professionals, Rialize is based on the school premises. It provides a very popular service that enables parents to drop off ahead of school opening time and pick up after school closing time.

Breakfast club runs from 07.30 to 08.30 and after school club from 15.00 to 18.00 (after school club for Reception—Year 6). Rialize also offers holiday clubs on the Bridgewater site.
