

SEN 1:1 Teaching Assistant

Location: Howe Dell Primary School

Pay grade – Grade H1-2 dependent upon skill set and experience.

Purpose of the role: To work with the class teacher and Assistant Headteacher for Inclusion as part of a professional team to support the teaching and learning of an individual pupil with complex Special Educational Needs (Autism Spectrum Disorder).

Main Responsibilities:

- Provide 1:1 support for a child with Special Educational Needs (Autism Spectrum Disorder).
- Implement planned learning activities/teaching programmes as agreed with the teacher, adjusting activities according to pupils' responses as appropriate and in relation to the child' personalised learning targets as outlined in their Education, Health and Care Plan.
- Provide feedback of the child's progress and attainment as part of the Education, Health and Care Plan review process.
- Participate in planning and evaluation of learning activities with the teacher, providing feedback to the teacher on pupil progress and behaviour.
- Support the teacher in monitoring, assessing and recording pupil progress/activities.
- Provide feedback to pupil in relation to attainment and progress under the guidance of the teacher.
- Support learning by arranging/providing resources for lessons/activities under the direction of the teacher.
- Support social and emotional well-being, adhering to any Pastoral Support Plan in place and reporting to the teacher and SENCo as appropriate.
- Share information about pupils with other staff, parents / carers, internal and external agencies, as appropriate.
- Under the class teacher's guidance, implement advice and support obtained from the Inclusion Team and any external agencies involved into the child's learning.
- Understand and support independent learning and Inclusion as required.
- To support and encourage self-independence.
- To adhere to and follow any Individual Risk Assessment, Risk Management Plan and Pastoral/Behaviour Support Plan in place at all times.
