

Moving from Ireland and beginning my career as a teacher during the pandemic was an incredibly stressful and daunting time, but the staff, leadership and pupils at Nicholas Breakspear were incredible and quickly embraced me as part of their community.



The atmosphere at the school is indescribable and the school's values of peace, justice, truth and love are ingrained within the walls. The students and staff are passionate about our values and about the school's mission - to build a better world. In doing so, we have developed a learning environment that promotes creativity, effectiveness and prosperity - for students and staff alike! I had always feared the journey from teacher training to NQT would be stressful, demanding and limiting, but the incredible teachers and SLT members of Nicholas Breakspear have continuously supported me, personally and professionally. Effective and structured whole-school policies helped ease any classroom management nerves I had and the modern, pupil-centred curriculum helped any planning concerns.

The department heads are well-organised, supportive

and constructive with regular feedback, allowing you to continually improve, and make you feel like an established member of your department. SLT are incredibly approachable and encourage you to share any suggestions with them, whether they relate to the whole school, or are on a smaller scale. Weekly Teaching & Learning briefings and regular department and year team meetings, ensure you are constantly learning from SEND leads, experienced teachers and members of SLT. The opportunities for development are amazing at NBS and after my first year I was given the opportunity to become an Assistant Head of Year, allowing me to experience the more pastoral side of teaching, and develop the necessary skills and qualities involved. I am also now the PSHE Co-Ordinator, giving me the opportunity to improve my curriculum planning skills and develop academic side of my career. I truly believe that NBS is a place where I will be continually given opportunities for development in whichever path my career takes me.

At NBS, there is a real commitment from each staff member to continually improve the experience of every pupil that comes through our doors. The pupils are caring, polite and well mannered, but also incredibly passionate about becoming the transformational leaders we continually encourage them to be. Your Development

Our Staff Development Programme supports our school mission not only to ensure that our students excel academically and fulfil their potential, but also see themselves as a fundamental part of building a better world. We passionately believe that our students need more than an education which follows the curriculum, and we support teachers through our development programme to ensure that the principles of Catholic Social Teaching are an important part of our pedagogy in every subject area. Through our training and development programme, Catholic teachers as well as those from the full spectrum of other faiths and none are fully included, and give their total support to the NBS mission, which is based on positivity, acceptance and freedom.

Our aim is to create passionate and motivated teachers through a sense of curiosity, challenge and fun in all our CPD, which is guided by the T&L Impact group: teachers who have volunteered to help research, develop and steer the NBS programme. There is a comprehensive in-house training programme which is ongoing and focusses on areas which support us in delivering an outstanding education for all our students

across all Departments. Our teaching is based on Rosenshine's principles, and focuses on the basis of our professional development programme. Our in-house CPD is delivered through a series of Breakfast Briefings (Friday mornings), through Department meetings, and through our interactive INSET days.

We also support colleagues in attending numerous external events including Herts for Learning's comprehensive programme of training courses. These include induction conferences for ECTs, to help deal with the challenges of the first years; training for leaders on how to prepare for the new curriculum; and everything in between, including subject-specific training.

Each year, all staff have an opportunity to review their work and set objectives at an appraisal meeting. There is a robust system of pay progression in place for teaching and support staff. Support for Early Career Teachers includes a reduced timetable, planned induction programme starting in July and mentor support. NBS frequently hosts work experience visits for those interested in a career in teaching, and we regularly provide placements for PGCE students.

Our Location

Nicholas Breakspear Catholic School is located on the outskirts of St Albans. As a result, the school benefits from large playing fields and views over the countryside. This location also means the school has easy access to major transport links such as the A414, A1 and M25.

St Albans is a town rich in history. Previously the site of Verulamium, once one of the largest towns in Roman Britain, a Roman amphitheatre, hypocaust and wall can all still be viewed. Nowadays St Albans is known as a historic market town, with medieval buildings, cobbled streets, Tudor architecture and Georgian houses. The one-thousand-year old Abbey dominates the skyline.

St Albans is a vibrant city. Many bars and restaurants can be found in the city centre, whilst there are also a number of theatres, museums, a twice weekly market and an art deco cinema. Within St Albans there are many parks and green spaces such as Verulamium Park, and the countryside is easily accessible. Heartwood Forest and the Ashridge Estate are both short drives away.

St Albans also benefits from its close connections with London. Within twenty minutes passengers form St Albans City train station can arrive at London St Pancreas.
