INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

Background: Hitchin Boys' School is a high achieving, all-ability, single sex school with over 1,000 pupils (aged 11-18) on roll and a mixed sixth form, which forms part of the highly successful Hitchin Schools' consortium.

Hitchin itself is a historic market town of approximately 40,000 inhabitants in North Hertfordshire 25 minutes from London by rail line and close to the A1(M) and M1.

The school population is a truly comprehensive ability intake and reflects the demographic of the locality with some 17% of boys coming from black and ethnic minority backgrounds and approximately 8% of all students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Our ethos: At Hitchin Boys' we pride ourselves on offering a warm and friendly environment where our boys are encouraged to fulfil their academic potential whilst developing a solid foundation of spiritual, social, moral and cultural awareness. Hitchin Boys' School helps all students to achieve according to their ability, and we celebrate success in many ways other than exam grades, ensuring that all our boys go on to the next step in their lives with a feeling of achievement and self-worth. Hitchin Boys' School is a demanding environment: we demand kindness and care for others; we demand courtesy and mutual respect; we demand enjoyment, happiness and enthusiasm. As a result we are committed to caring for each and every one of our students and helping our young boys become well-rounded, successful young men.

Hitchin Boys' School was judged Outstanding by Ofsted in January 2016. We believe that the inspectors accurately identified our strength as a school when they said: "The academy's motto, 'striving for excellence', is reflected strongly in all aspects of school life. **Pupils thrive because personal development and academic excellence are promoted equally well.**" OFSTED 2016. Facilities: The school is a historic site itself with Grade II listed buildings as well as state of the art facilities opened in January 2019. Further new building work is planned and the new Performing Arts building is scheduled to open in September 2019, with a 220 seater auditorium and cutting edge recording technology

The school has consistently been over-subscribed for many years, and Hertfordshire County Council recently provided funding which has enabled us to increase our facilities to accommodate an additional 45 students in every new intake. For the next 6 years therefore the school will continue to expand. This provides some financial support to help us through these difficult times in education, it also means that there will be new roles created within the school to manage demands both academic and pastoral of these increased numbers.

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Curriculum: The school is an 8 form entry school and runs a 25 period week. For most subjects boys are taught in these groups until Year 8 when some setting takes place. Class sizes are low overall. Strong consortium links exist with the other local secondary schools, Hitchin Girls' and The Priory School.

The curriculum has always been broad and balanced with an explicit commitment to maintaining the full range of learning, knowledge, understanding and skills in all aspects of the boys' education, including the humanities and linguistic, mathematical, scientific, technical, social, physical and artistic learning.

All boys in KS4 study the usual core of English, Maths and Science, and also either History or Geography (or both in many cases) and almost every boy studies a Modern Foreign Language up to GCSE and then a wide range of option choices. The creative aspects of learning in Art, Drama and Music and Technology play a significant part in the life of the school. The uptake of Science & Maths is very strong in 6th Form and with large groups taking all humanities subjects (History, Geography, Sociology, Philosophy & Ethics) to A-Level, it is fair to say that the school provides significant breadth ensuring students keep their options for life open as long as possible.

Examination results: Pupils traditionally score well at public examination, with over 80% going into the sixth form from Year 11 and our boys continue to achieve at the highest level. On average over these years over 80% of the boys achieved the threshold of English and Maths graded at the new level 4. Approximately one in every **three grades** was one of the new top grade level 8 or 9 and around 15% of boys achieved all top grades, with well over **50%** achieving at least one top grade. As always there were boys who achieved GCSE passes despite facing significant challenges and we celebrate their progress just as much. Our A-Level results were once again well above national averages across the Consortium with some outstanding individual outcomes (including 30% of all grades at A/A*). As is always the case, the vast majority of last year's Year 13 students are on their way to universities across the country.

Extra-curricular programme: Extra-curricular activities are an important part of school life. Over 500 boys playing representative sport for the school, over 250 boys learning and performing music on an extra-curricular basis, a thriving House system and many other clubs, societies and events. The annual musical theatre production runs over three days every year involving upwards of 50 boys and 10 staff ("Spamalot" last year; "Cabaret" in 2019). We hold three main charity events every year raising in the region of £ 9,000 each time. Sporting excellence is also a defining feature of the school in many sports, although most notably this year we will be representing England at the World Schools Athletics Championships. Finally it would be difficult to list all the opportunities for extra-curricular school trips boys because there are so many ranging from day trips to art galleries to life-changing trips abroad such as China, Malaysia, Iceland and Peru.

It is this determination to give students the best possible experience both in and outside the classroom which characterises Hitchin Boys' School and we hope this has given you a flavour of the variety, breadth and success of our school – of which you may soon become an important part!
