About our School

St John's C of E School, in the heart of Watford, believes that every pupil is entitled to success and that with an engaging, rich curriculum St John's will challenge all pupils to succeed.

St John's C of E is a Free School working in partnership with the Diocese of St Albans. The rationale for the school is to help meet the growing need for more school places, as well as providing the choice of an inclusive church school. Mrs Langeveld has a wealth of experience within primary education. She already has a well-developed educational network that enriches our school, and is always seeking further opportunities to expand that network of support, both locally and nationally, to learn from and share experiences.

The school journey from an initial one form entry in temporary accommodation to a two form entry 420 capacity primary school has now started. We have a diverse intake that incorporates EAL children.



Our Vision, Values and Ethos

St John's is at the heart of a richly diverse community. The education and services it provides serves the whole community, valuing and making the most of its dynamic blend of ethnicities, languages, cultures and religions. Its extended school activities will widen horizons for both children and adults alike. Christian Ethos


The Christian ethos of loving your neighbour, respecting each other, and valuing diversity will be integral to our school life.

The ethos of the school is:

- Be rooted in Christian values
- Enable all children to explore the Christian faith, experiencing collective worship and prayer
- Enable children to have an understanding of people of variety of faiths.

Inclusivity

St John's is committed to high expectations for all and embracing equality. The Christian ethos of loving your neighbour, respecting each other, and valuing diversity is integral to our school life. St John's School welcomes pupils and parents/carers of all faiths and no faith. Our school is based in the parish of St John's Watford, which serves the local community by welcoming all people to join in many activities run by the church. For example, Messy Church each month attracts approximately 120 adults and children.



Developing the Whole Child

The school is committed to all aspects of a child's development, supporting them to become responsible and moral members of the community, to make healthy lifestyle choices and to become creative and inquisitive life-long learners. Through education inside and outside the classroom, the school will raise awareness of core British values and prepare children for life in modern Britain.

The school will enable children to:

- Develop as creative and inquisitive independent learners
 - Understand right and wrong and achieve exemplary standards of behaviour
 - Make healthy lifestyle choices
 - Have opportunities for reflection and spiritual growth.

Community Spirit

The school is at the heart of our community, serving those that need us and instilling values of service and community in our children.

The school strives to:

- Have strong links with the Parish Church and wider community
- Encourage children, staff, parents and carers, Church and local community to work together as a team
- Develop social responsibility through serving others in the local community
- Build a strong partnership with parents to support the education of their children and the life of the school
- Provide support for families through local services, social events, adult education courses and parenting advice.



Children in our school have the opportunity find out about each other's faith and what it means to live as member of that faith community. There are opportunities for children of other faiths to share and celebrate their festivals in the school.

Values Based Learning

The school has a carefully planned and in depth focus on values which has a positive impact on behaviour, well-being, relationships and attitudes to learning. The core Christian values underpin the ethos, relationships, the curriculum and all learning experiences in the school.

Collective Worship

There is a daily act of collective worship in school or church. Whole school collective worship is fully inclusive and there is no assumption that all pupils are expected to follow Christian beliefs. If pupils are withdrawn from collective worship, the school ensures that alternative provision is meaningful and relevant.
