Buntingford First School Information for Applicants

The School

Buntingford First School (BFS) is Hertfordshire's first zero carbon school and as such is a trailblazing sustainability project for the county and Scholars' Education Trust. The school is due to open in September 2023 and will be a brand new build, meeting the need for school places in the Buntingford area.

Once open the school will have the capacity to become a two-form entry First School and nursery for three to nine year olds.

The Location

Built on a former Sainsbury's depot, Buntingford First School is easily accessible by road, situated on London Road adjacent to The Bury football ground, close to the A10. Situated on the southern edge of the town the school is just a 15 minute walk (<1 mile) from Buntingford town centre, ideally located for the local community.

The Building and Facilities

The new build adheres to Passivhaus standards which will improve the school's air quality, reduce carbon emissions and lower its energy running costs.

Over 300 solar panels, triple glazed windows and air-source heat pumps will be installed. The school will also include a rooftop outdoor classroom and numerous play areas and a forest school. Teaching spaces in the school will face north, avoiding south-facing windows that cause rooms to over-heat, while social areas such as the school dining hall and school hall will face south.



The Curriculum

At Buntingford First School, we will offer a varied, creative and inspiring curriculum that provides opportunities for all our children to enhance and develop their knowledge and skills. Through real life experiences and extracurricular activities, our schemes of learning will ensure that all children achieve the best educational outcome, alongside developing their confidence, social, and emotional skills.

The overriding objective at Buntingford First School will be to enable each individual, whatever their ability level, to develop to his or her maximum potential. To do this we will have a stimulating and challenging curriculum and we carefully monitor each pupil's academic progress.

Scholars' Education Trust expect the school be at the heart of its community working closely with its neighbours to improve the educational outcomes for all Buntingford children. It will work in partnership with local Buntingford schools as well as the other schools in the Scholars' Education Trust.

Scholars' Education Trust

Scholars' Education Trust was founded in 2012 and now consists of 6 schools: Buntingford First School, Harpenden Academy, Priory Academy, Robert Barclay Academy, Samuel Ryder Academy and Sir John Lawes School. We are a cross phase trust providing a high-quality education for more than 4.5 thousand children between the ages of 4 and 18. Within our family of schools we have a primary, an all-through school, two secondaries and an extended secondary.

The Trust aims to ensure that the skills and experience of staff at all the schools are maximised to ensure that the students in our care receive the best education possible. Expertise in teaching and learning is shared across the entire trust and support systems are centralised to enable the schools to achieve maximum efficiency from all our resources. Vacancy

- Shortlisted candidates will be contacted and advised on the interview programme requirements in advance

Interview day

- Includes tour of the school, meet the team and a formal interview (tasks, lesson observation and student panel may also be included)
- To meet Safer Recruitment guidelines candidates will be requested to bring relevant documentation confirming their identity and qualifications.
- References will be requested prior to the interview day
- All candidates will be advised of the interview decisions within 48 hours; a feedback will be offered if requested
